## About Our Heroes

**SSG Frank T. Carvill** was the first born child of Irish immigrants Mary and Daniel Carvill. Frank grew up in the small northern New Jersey town of Carlstadt. He graduated from Rutgers University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science. Frank was a voracious reader with a fondness for American history with an emphasis on the Revolutionary and Civil wars. Frank was 51 years old and a twenty year veteran of the New Jersey National Guard when he volunteered to serve in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Frank was the First Vice President for the New York County Armagh Association (father's side) and a member of the County Cork Association (mother's side), Ancient Order of Hibernians-Division 7, the Brehon Law Society and a founding member of the Emerald Isle Immigration Center. Frank worked as a Paralegal for the Port Authority of New York/New Jersey. He survived both World Trade Center terrorist attacks. On February 26, 1993 Frank helped a disabled co-worker down 56 flights of smoke filled stairs. On 9/11 he had just stepped out of WTC 1 or North Tower when he heard a jet in downtown Manhattan. Moments latter American Airlines Flight # 11 barreled into the Northeast face of the North tower. He also witnessed the second plane; United Airlines Flight # 175, flying into the Southwest face of WTC 2 or South Tower. The world changed for everyone that day, including Frank T. Carvill. From Iraq Frank wrote "Our occupation is not intended to be forever. I don't know how we can get out in the short run. We as a nation are going to have to absorb huge costs both in money and in lives for several more years. It will not be easy." Frank is remembered as a loving son, brother, uncle, nephew and friend.

**SPC Christopher M. Duffy** was born on August 3, 1977 in Neptune, NJ. He grew up in Brick, NJ and graduated from Brick Township High School in 1996. He loved to play basketball and was involved in many adult leagues; as well as coaching CYO basketball for Visitation Church. He was an employee of Ocean's One Medical Transport and later a butcher at Lenny's Silverton Market. In 2000 Chris enlisted in the New Jersey Army National Guard where he was proud to serve his country. On June 4, 2004 Chris was KIA while serving with the 3<sup>rd</sup> 112<sup>th</sup> FA when his convoy was attacked in Baghdad. He is survived by his wife, Casey, and their son, Ryan Christopher, as well as countless family members and friends who miss him dearly. Not a day goes by that we are not thankful to Chris and the many other brave men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice to defend their country and keep us safe from harm.

**SSG Humberto Timoteo** was born in Aviero, Portugal on December 13, 1978 and immigrated to America in his early childhood. He spent most of his free time with family and friends, and participated in activities such as boy scouts and baseball. He enlisted in the Army when he was 17 with his parents consent. He completed a three-year hardship tour in Korea and was later stationed at Fort Drum before joining the New Jersey National Guard's 3rd Battalion, 112th Field Artillery. He was employed full-time with Continental Airlines at Newark Liberty International Airport and enjoyed traveling whenever possible. He met his wife, Silvia, while stationed in Fort Drum and had a little boy named Giovannie. Humberto loved the military; he took great pride in his military accomplishments, always expressed his dedication and never neglected his duty to his country. He was deployed for combat duty with the 3/112th Field Artillery in support of the early stages of Operation Iraqi Freedom. His unit experienced heavy engagements with the enemy to include small arms fire, rocket propelled grenades, and improvised explosive devices on a regular basis. SSG Humberto Timoteo gave the ultimate sacrifice for his country in Baghdad, Iraq on June 5, 2004. He currently rests at Holy Cross Cemetery in North Arlington, New Jersey.

**SGT Ryan Edward Doltz** was born on January 12, 1978. He grew up in Mine Hill and graduated from Dover High School where he played football and tuba. He also graduated from the Virginia Military Institute, Class of 2000, with a major in history and a minor in business. While a cadet Ryan joined the Virginia National Guard. In 1998 he was one of the cadets featured in a commercial for Norelco filmed at VMI. Following graduation he was deployed in support of Operation Noble Eagle. In 2003 Ryan transferred to the 3/112<sup>th</sup> FA of the New Jersey National Guard and went to work for Moretrench American in Rockaway, NJ. In January, 2004 during training for deployment to Iraq he broke both of his heels. His recovery was supposed to take at least 6 months. Ryan was determined to join his unit and in just a little over two months convinced the doctors that he was ready for deployment. Ryan arrived in Iraq on Good Friday, 2004. On June 5, 2004, as they returned from a combat mission Ryan's vehicle hit an IED and he died as a result of his injuries. He is survived by his parents, Cheryl and Raymond; his sister, Anne; and his brother, Gregory. He was laid to rest in Section 60 of Arlington National Cemetery on June 16, 2004, amid America's brightest and best.
